Pound System-Wide Improvements 2023

We have 12-15 Easements to get done. Working through the Environmental on some of the funding. Hoping to Bid this summer.

Appalachia Elementary School Sewer

We are continuing with design. Scheduling meetings with the Health Department to go through some flow rates requirements as we look to make it as feasible as possible given the low water flows.

As we applied for last year, and were successful in receiving funds from VDH's Equitable Access to Drinking Water Fund, we are yet again able to apply for the final year of funding available. The funding is available for those systems that have consolidated or are about to consolidate to help O&M costs incurred by the receiving utility. Therefore, the Board needs to grant authorization to make the application for the Equitable Access Drinking Water Fund.

The motion was passed.

We received bids in March for work at the Pound Water Plant and to construct two (2) storage tanks. We received zero bids for the plant work and have worked to negotiate an acceptable project size with the tank contractor for Division 2. With the funding we have available and working with the contractor, they have offered to reduce the price of everything and honor their existing bid price to do the \$500,000 tank at the water plant and fencing. We must award the bid at the original amount with a subsequent change order to reduce the project award. We have

preliminary funding agency approval for our scope change and will make sure we get final approval and have legal counsel review before we do any contracts.

A motion was made by Rusty Peters, and seconded by Robby Robbins, that the Board award Division 2 of the Pound Water Plant Project to Mid-Atlantic Storage Solutions, Inc. in the amount of \$2,384,954 with a subsequent change order to reduce the project award to \$743,710 pending funding agency approval and legal counsel review. DIRECTOR'S ITEMS

Natural Gas Study

The PSA commissioned a natural gas feasibility study in December 2020 to look at what it would take, and if it was feasible, for the PSA to begin a natural gas utility. The study was put on hold in the summer of 2021 due to the consolidation of Pound's water and wastewater systems.

The consultant was asked to complete the study and share findings with the PSA. The study has been completed and the findings are as expected from conversations during the process. If the PSA were to become a viable natural gas utility, we would need to look at acquiring assets from the existing provider in the region to provide immediate revenue needed to fund the new utility.

In discussions with Appalachian Natural Gas during the study, they were adamant that they were not interested in selling any Wise County assets to the PSA.

Roll-off Service

Per the request of the Board, we have some preliminary numbers should the PSA start a roll-off dumpster service. We do have a truck currently which was purchased to haul sludge from the Pound WWTP to the County landfill. We also currently have two (2) 30-CY containers for hauling sludge.

The major items to be purchased to begin the service will of course be containers for rent/use, as well as another truck to have and leave one as a spare. A new employee to drive the truck would be required as well.

The following is a breakdown of some very preliminary fees which may be charged for the service:

Delivery/Haul Fee - \$135 2-week Container Rental Fee (minimum) - \$75 Monthly Container Rental Fee - \$150 Re-spot Fee (same site only) - \$100 Tipping Fees - County price per ton

PSA New Branding

Over the last few years, the PSA has grown exponentially in coverage area and by providing new services. As such, our existing branding was specifically focused on drinking water only. We are no longer a drinking water-only provider, our branding or logo should be updated to reflect our newer, broader scope of services. We want to honor where we began and at the same time not limit where we can go.

We have been working with Arnett-Muldrow to re-brand the PSA. The basis for the design is an infinity symbol that pays homage to the mountains (green) and the mountain streams (blue) which provide our water resources. The sun idea is borrowed from the County Tourism logo. This logo and branding set up a boundless future of growth and services to be offered by the PSA to meet the needs of our citizens.
